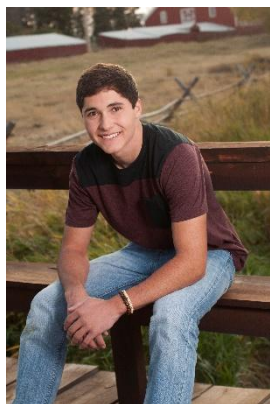
2017 HOPE Scholarship Recipients

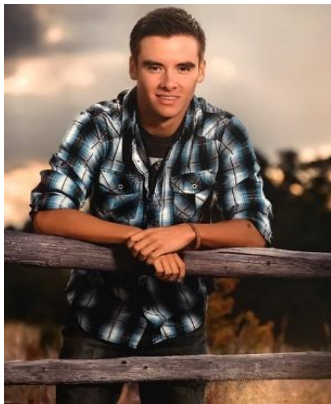
